The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. The law applies to all schools that receive funds under an applicable program of the U.S. Department of Education. Western Texas College cannot, except in certain limited situations, release grades or other personally identifiable information to any person, other than the student, without a written release from the student.
